Can there be a serious difference between how right men think they are and how right or wrong God knows they are? 4. How does God feel about those who are proud in their hearts? 5. Have you recently exhibited this pride in your own heart? 6. The how does God feel about youo according to this verse?

Has following youor own heart ever led you to practice any religious or moral evil?
14.	 Luke 8:4-15 1. What kind of ground is the good and honest heart? 2. Do those with a good and honest heart hear their own feelings and follow them or do they hear, hold, and live the Word of God? 3. What kind of ground will you prove to be after this study?
15.	Hebrews 4:12,13; John 12:48 1. Is the Word of God in the Bible dead or alive? 2. Is the Word of God active today? 3. Is the Word of the Lord able to expose the thoughts and intentions of a persons heart? 4. Will we be judged according to our sincerity, our feelings, our desires, or by the Word of Christ? 5. Up to this day, have you truly been taught the Word of Christ well enough so that you are ready to be judged by it? 6. Then where does this leave you?
16.	Acts 1:24;15:8 1. Who is it that knows the hearts of all men? 2. Should we presume to know our own hearts or the hearts of other people? 3. Should we therefore trust in something that we cannot know?
17.	Proverbs.28:26 1. Who will be delivered? 2. What does God call those who trust in the feeling in their own heart? 3. What have you been following more, your heart, or the Bible? 4. Then what does this verse call you?

Yes, the Bible clearly says that we are to "Love the Lord your God with all your heart...". But there is a great difference between loving and following God with all of our heart, and following after and trusting in our heart! We are to trust with our hearts, and not put our trust in our hearts! Remember! It isn't in the heart a man believes, resulting in righteousness. Rather it is "with the heart man believes, resulting in righteousness"!
